 - b) Organisational structure and hierarchy of the station.
 - c) Roles and responsibilities of various departments and personnel.
 - d) Programme schedule and programming patterns, including news, educational, cultural, entertainment, and special broadcasts.
 - e) Production process of radio programmes.
 - f) Studio facilities, transmission systems, and technological infrastructure.
 - g) Audience engagement initiatives and community outreach activities.
 - h) Newsroom operations and news production workflow (where applicable).

i) Challenges faced by the station in the contemporary media environment.

j) The relevance and role of All India Radio in serving local communities and promoting public service broadcasting.
