PROJECT-RELATED RESEARCH (MASOD 105P)

Work on ANY ONE of the projects given below:

1. Conduct an interview with a manual worker in an unorganized industry (such as brick kiln, restaurant, hotels and domestic worker) and write a report about their daily life.
2. Conduct a case study of 3 to 5 individuals with one or more form of addictions (drug, tobacco, alcohol, social media, etc.) and prepare a report about the pattern they follow in everyday life.
3. Conduct focus group discussion on un-employment in a colony or village and write a report about major findings from the discussion.
4. Conduct an observation of one festival/ritual/social practice of one community (other than one's own) and prepare a report based on your findings.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR PROJECT-RELATED RESEARCH (MASOD 105P)

1. **INTRODUCTION:** Project-Related Research (MASOD 105P) is an independent research-oriented paper offered in the MA Sociology programme. The paper is designed to introduce learners to the fundamentals of sociological research, academic writing, and prepare a report in accordance with UGC guidelines for Distance and Online Education.

2. **OBJECTIVES:** The objectives of Project-Related Research (MASOD 105P) are to enable learners to:

- Develop an understanding of sociological research processes.
- Identify and articulate a researchable sociological problem.
- Review and critically engage with existing literature.
- Formulate clear research questions and objectives.
- Prepare a structured and academically sound research report.

6. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR SUPERVISOR:

The programme allows the students to choose their supervisor, but the selection is subject to the following criteria:

- i. Assistant Professor or above with a PhD in Sociology or a related discipline, permanently affiliated to a recognized higher education institution, with relevant research experience.

OR

- ii. Assistant Professor or above with a Master's degree in Sociology, NET qualified, and having a minimum of two years of full-time teaching and/or research experience in a recognized institution.

OR

- iii. A qualified professional with interdisciplinary expertise (e.g., Social Work, Development Studies, Gender Studies), permanently employed in a recognized academic or research institution.

Note:

- i. *A supervisor may guide a maximum of five students. A token remuneration as per the Tezpur University norm will be paid per student upon submission of the final dissertation.*
- ii. *If a learner is nominating your own project supervisor, please upload the supervisor's details here before beginning your project work. Ensure that the proposed supervisor meets the prescribed eligibility criteria. ([Available Here](#))*

7. DEPARTMENTAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE (DAC)

A DAC will be constituted to ensure academic rigour and oversight. Responsibilities include:

- Verifying supervisor eligibility and matching with student topics.
- Constituting an Assessment Committee to monitor progress.

8. ACADEMIC SUPPORT IN ODL/ONLINE MODE

To ensure structured engagement, the following modalities will be adopted:

- Scheduled online or in-person meetings with supervisors (monthly across semesters).
- Participation in webinars or workshops on proposal writing, research ethics, data analysis, and citation.
- Access to digital libraries and academic databases.
- Fieldwork or community engagement where feasible, to promote experiential learning.

10. EVALUATION OF PROJECT-RELATED RESEARCH (MASOD 105P)

- Total marks for Project- Related Research (MASOD105P) is of 100 marks.
- Minimum 50% required to pass the Project- Related Research (MASOD105P)
- Assessment will be conducted by an external evaluator appointed by CDOE, TU.

11. RESUBMISSION POLICY

If a student fails, they may revise and resubmit the dissertation within the stipulated timeframe by paying a re-evaluation fee.

12. EXEMPTION CLAUSE

The project/dissertation is a mandatory component of the MA Sociology programme. No exemptions are permitted.
