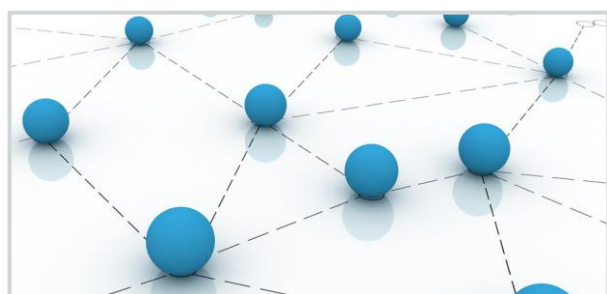

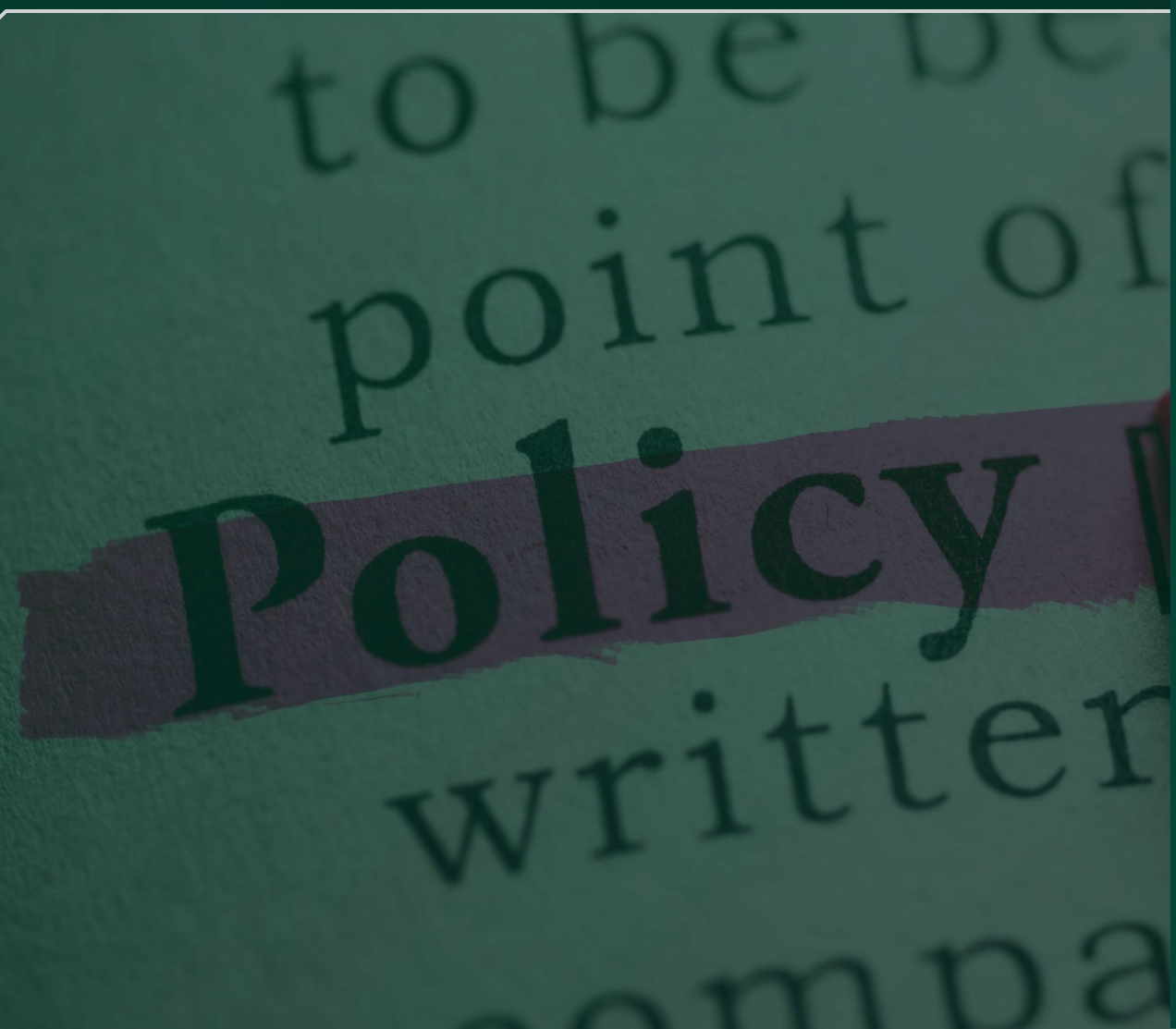

Academic Regulations & Credit





Academic Session

The academic session shall ordinarily commence twice a year, generally in January and July, or as notified by the University in accordance with UGC-DEB notification.

Academic Programme

An Academic Programme shall consist of a set of Courses. Completion of the set of courses by a learner prescribed for a programme shall lead to the award of a Degree or a Diploma to the learner concerned.

Course

A course is a unit of instruction or segment of a subject area under any discipline. Each programme shall consist of a set of courses.

Credit

Each course carries a specified number of credits based on the academic workload involved. In the Master programmes, each course is of 4 credits, with a total requirement of **80 credits** for degree completion. The Diploma in Human Resource Management requires 32 credits, while the Diploma in Environmental and Disaster Management and Diploma in Child Rights and Governance require 28 credits each. One credit represents the prescribed quantum of learning and study hours.

Credits Earned

The total credits earned by a learner on a programme are the sum of the credits specified for the courses completed by the learner securing pass grades.

Credit Requirement

Each programme has a prescribed minimum credit requirement, including specific credits for different course categories as per UGC-DEB guidelines. Learners must earn the required credits in all categories to be eligible for the award of the degree or diploma.

Letter Grades and Grade Point

Letter Grade indicates a learner's level of academic achievement in a course. Grades O to P are considered pass grades, while F denotes a fail grade. Each letter grade corresponds to a Grade Point, and grades are awarded using the relative grading system.

Assignment

Assignment submission is compulsory for all learners and must be submitted within the prescribed period of time notified by CDOE-TU.

Submission of assignments is mandatory irrespective of whether the learner:

- Appears in the semester-end examination
- Does not appear in the semester-end examination; or
- Has failed in any previous semester examination.

Learners failing to submit assignments shall not be permitted to appear in the semester-end examination. Assignments must be original work and free from plagiarism. Copied or plagiarized assignments shall not be evaluated and may invite disciplinary action

Instruction Methodology

The medium of instruction / examination in the University at all levels is English except for the language courses

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) & Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA):

The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is the weighted average of the grade points secured by a learner in all credit courses registered and passed during a semester.

Formula:

$$SGPA = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^n C_i G_i}{\sum_{i=1}^n C_i}$$

C_i = Course Credit, G_i = Grade Point

Where:

- C_i = Credit value of the i th course
- G_i = Grade point obtained in the i th course
- C_t = Total credits earned in the semester

Total Credits (C_t): $C_t = \sum C_i$

Where n is the total number of courses registered and passed during the semester.
Note: Courses awarded an 'I' (Incomplete) grade are not included in the calculation of SGPA.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is the accumulated weighted average of grade points earned by a learner across all semesters of a programme.

Formula:

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum_{j=1}^m S_j C_j}{\sum_{j=1}^m C_j}$$

S_j = Semester GPA, C_j = Semester Credits

Where:

- C_i = Credit value of the i th course
- G_i = Grade point obtained in the i th course
- C_τ = Total credits earned across all semesters

Total Credits (C_τ):

$C_\tau = \sum C_i$

Where N is the total number of courses registered and successfully completed by the learner from the commencement of the programme.

ADMISSION PROCESS



Admission notice

Admission notifications shall be published through official website and other relevant media well before the commencement of each academic session.

Mode of Admission

- Online admission only
- Centralized admission through CDOE official portal

✓ All previous examinations for the qualifying degree must be cleared without any carry-over papers and the prescribed eligibility criteria must be fulfilled.	✓ Proof of passing the qualifying examination with the requisite qualification must be submitted before the Semester-End Examination. Failure to do so will render the candidate ineligible to appear for the examination.

Reservation Policy: Wherever applicable the relevant Govt. of India rules on reservation shall be adhered to. Certificate of Sponsorship / Caste/ PWD/ PRC etc. are to be uploaded by the concerned aspirant. Original certificates are to be produced at the centre for verification when called for.

Simultaneous enrolment in programmes of CDOE: Learners may simultaneously pursue more than one programme in CDOE. The enrolment can only be in accordance with the guidelines issued by the UGC–Distance Education Bureau (DEB) and the Government of India.

Learner pursuing a programme through regular mode can also enroll for a programme in distance mode simultaneously as per UGC.

Provisional Admission: Candidates awaiting the results of the last qualifying examination may be granted provisional admission, subject to fulfilment of the prescribed eligibility criteria. Proof of passing the qualifying examination must be submitted before appearing in the semester-end examination, failing which the learner shall not be permitted to appear in the examination.

Document Verification: Applicants shall upload scanned copies of all relevant certificates, including caste, PwD, PRC, sponsorship, and other supporting documents, wherever applicable. Original documents must be produced for physical verification on the stipulated date/s decided by the Centre.

SEMESTER ENROLLMENT AND COURSE REGISTRATION

Admission to all programmes under CDOE is semester-wise. Every learner shall complete semester enrolment and course registration at the beginning of each semester by submitting the prescribed enrolment-cum-course registration form and paying the prescribed semester fee. Semester enrolment is compulsory irrespective of whether the learner:

- Appears in the previous semester examination;
- Does not appear in the previous semester examination; or
- Fails in one or more courses of the previous semester examination. Subsequent semester fees must be paid within thirty (30) days from the last date of the semester-end examination of the preceding semester.

Failure to complete semester enrolment within the prescribed period may affect continuation of studies and examination eligibility.

SELF–LEARNING MATERIALS (SLM)

Soft copy of Self-learning materials shall be available for download in CDOE website. Learners seeking print copies can obtain the same by paying the processing fee as prescribed by the Centre depending on the availability of the materials at CDOE. Audio- Visual Learning aids are also available.

Section: VI

EVALUATION & CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS



Examination Registration

All learners must register separately for semester-end examinations. Submission of the examination form is mandatory for every semester. No learner shall be permitted to appear in semester-end examinations unless:

- Semester enrolment has been completed
- Assignments have been submitted
- Examination form has been submitted; and
- Examination fee has been paid.

Examination Fee

An examination fee of ₹500 per course shall be payable at the time of examination registration. This fee is separate from Programme Fee, Semester Fee, Project Fee or Dissertation Fee.

Re-scrutiny

A learner may apply for re-scrutiny of answer scripts after declaration of results by paying ₹100 per course, within the prescribed period notified by CDOE. Re-scrutiny includes:

- Verification of totaling
- Verification of mark transfer
- Verification of unevaluated answers.

Re-evaluation

- ✓ A learner may apply for re-evaluation by paying ₹500 per course, within the prescribed period after declaration of results.
- ✓ Re-evaluation shall be carried out by an examiner other than the original evaluator.
- ✓ The marks/grade awarded after re-evaluation shall be final and binding.

Betterment Examination

A learner who has successfully passed a course but wishes to improve his/her academic performance may apply for a Betterment Examination by paying ₹1,000 per course and fulfilling the following eligibility:

- Betterment shall be allowed only for Semester-End Examination components (Theory Papers).
- A learner may apply for Betterment Examination only for 25% of the total programme or 1 course per respective semester.
- A learner may appear for the Betterment Examination in the immediate next semester end examination.

Result of Betterment Examination:

The higher of the two performances (original examination or betterment examination) shall be considered for the computation of grades, SGPA, and CGPA.

If for some reason a learner fails to appear in the betterment examination, his/her original marks against the paper will be considered.

The decision of the University regarding Betterment Examination shall be final.

Evaluation

The system of evaluation shall be as follows:

- Continuous Evaluation (30%) – Assessment through written assignments worth 30 marks per course, to be submitted to CDOE.
- Semester-End Examination (70%) – Final examination carrying 70 marks for each course
- Dissertation/Project Evaluation – 60% weightage for the written report and 40% for the oral presentation/viva voce.

In case of practical component in the Programme

If a programme has a practical component, the weightage of the theory and practical shall be as follows: Theory 75% and practical 25%.

Award of Degree / Diploma

A learner shall be eligible for the award of a Degree or Diploma upon:

- Successful completion of all prescribed courses
- Earning the required programme credits
- Securing the minimum CGPA prescribed by the University
- Completing project/dissertation requirements wherever applicable;
- Fulfillment of all academic and administrative requirements of the programme.

CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS

Semester end examination

- Examinations are conducted at the designated centres of CDOE, Tezpur University.
- Evaluation of answer scripts is carried out at CDOE, Tezpur University.
- Results are published online in CDOE website.
- Grading follows the University's letter-grade system.
- Examination schedules are announced in advance on the CDOE website.
- Successful learners may apply for Provisional Certificates and Transcripts.

Practical Examination

- a. Practical examinations are conducted by course teachers nominated by the concerned department and appointed by CDOE.
- b. Practical examinations are generally held before the semester-end theory examinations.

Grade Card and Transcript

- a. Transcript: After completion of the final semester, the Controller of Examinations issues a transcript showing course grades, SGPA, CGPA, and total credits earned.
- b. Grade Card: Learners may collect their grade card in person or receive it by post upon request.

Action against Unfair Means

Semester end examination: Possession or use of unauthorized electronic devices, printed materials, handwritten notes, or any prohibited aids during examinations is considered an unfair means practice. Such violations may result in an F (Fail) grade in the course and may invite disciplinary action, including withdrawal from the programme.

Assignment: Direct copying from any print and electronic source or copying of another assignment will be considered as unfair means in relation to assignment/s.

Unfair means detected at any stage till evaluation of answer scripts shall be liable for necessary action under 'unfair means'

Important Note

- Learners should regularly visit the CDOE website for updates on admissions, assignments, examinations, counselling sessions, and results.
- Any change in contact details must be communicated to CDOE promptly.
- Self-Learning Materials (SLMs) are available online. **When ready, print SLM may be applied by paying a processing fee depending of the availability of the material.**
- Submission of assignments on stipulated time is mandatory for examination **registration.**
- Registration and payment of the prescribed fee are required before each semester-end examinations.
- Academic counselling and learner support are provided through online and/or offline modes.
